#### IN THIS ISSUE

## JFS OTTAWA'S IMPACT

#### **TIKVAH PROGRAM**

Offers clients direct financial relief, case management, counselling, advocacy and access to food security programs. Last year:

- 97 families received monthly financial assistance, including holiday support
- 114 families accessed fresh produce monthly
- 87 families were referred to the Kosher Food Bank

#### **SHALOM BAYIT**

Supports Jewish women experiencing domestic violence and abuse. 25 women were referred to our specialized counsellor last year.

#### THELMA STEINMAN SENIORS SUPPORT SERVICES

Assists Jewish seniors to live independently and to enhance their quality of life. Last year:

- We assisted 37 clients with 735 drives to/from appointments
- 24 clients benefited from 576 home visits
- We hosted 223 sessions of our Adult Day Program for 13 clients
- 76 Holocaust survivors were connected with 1,266 services
- 2,462 Kosher Meals on Wheels were delivered to 41 clients

#### **CHILDREN, YOUTH & FAMILIES**

Receive a full range of counselling services including social skills groups, bullying workshops, psycho-educational assessments and Jewish day-school support. We support 19 students every week.

#### WHAT INFLUENCES OUR PROGRAMS

#### Cuts to Legal Aid's Critical Services are Devasting.

As an agency we are very concerned about cuts to legal aid services in Ontario. Recently we sent a letter sharing our concerns about how these cuts will affect our clients and demanded that MPP Mulroney consider reversing the decision to make these devasting cuts. Below is part of the letter we sent:

"I am writing today to share with you how critical legal aid services are to our clients and how deeply concerned we are with the proposed cuts to Legal Aid services. At Jewish Family Services we work with vulnerable clients who depend on legal aid services for assistance with legal matters, who could not otherwise have legal representation, something which is core to our values as Canadians. At JFS we work with low income individuals and families, vulnerable refugees and newcomers, women fleeing abuse and other marginalized groups and we are already seeing the effects these cuts are making and ask that you reconsider these devastating cuts to legal aid. Ottawa's legal clinics assist the most vulnerable people in Ottawa to preserve their basic essentials: keeping stable housing and avoiding eviction; maintaining income support benefits so people can support their families with the basics; and resolving complex immigration legal issues."

#### **HELPING ONE SENIOR**

Mrs. T, a 76 year old client of our Thelma Steinman Seniors Support Program, joined our Russian-speaking day program in 2017 and described it as "For a long time, I didn't have a Jewish community but now I have a lot of friends because of this program. I feel more connected and part of the Jewish community."

For Mrs. T, the day program has encouraged her to try new things, remain active and create a community among her peers.





#### **HELPING ONE FAMILY**

Nicolas and Sandy Audrit arrived from Belgium to Canada in July 2018.

After learning about members of his family perishing in the Holocaust, Nicolas reclaimed his Jewish heritage and moved his young family to Canada looking for safety, opportunity and a stronger sense of belonging. Supported by JIAS (Jewish Immigrant Aid Services), the family settled in the Ottawa area.

JFS Ottawa helped Nicolas and Sandy to enroll their kids in Jewish school and connect them to a vibrant and inclusive Ottawa Jewish community.

#### **NEW PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT OUR CLIENTS**

#### JFS Community Fridge

JFS Tikvah staff are always developing ways to increase the level of food security and engagement with our clients through a respectful and meaningful lens.

We are very excited to share that we have launched a new Barrier Free Food initiative this spring. Starting with a generous donation of a new commercial glass display fridge from David Smith, we are able to fill the fridge weekly with tasty prepared food fresh from the kitchen of Creative Kosher Catering every Monday. We are delighted to add this partnership with David Smith to our suite of services that include the Miriam's Well program and referrals to the Kosher Food bank as well as programs that encourage engagement with our clients.

The response of those that have accessed the fridge is heartwarming. In the first few weeks of this initiative we have already provided meals to 25+ families in need. Due to incredible demand, JFS NEEDS VOLUNTEERS to support this program. Call us if interested.

This is just one of the ways we can support our vulnerable clients in the Jewish community. We are always looking for partners who would like to join us in our goal to leave no vulnerable Jewish person behind.


## STAFF MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

JFS has so many remarkable staff that impact so many lives. Today, we spotlight Nimo Abubakar. Nimo has worked at JFS since 2009, and is seconded to the Somali Centre for Family Services where she is the Case Manager and Volunteer Coordinator for the Diverse Seniors Support Services Unit.

In 2003, Nimo went to visit her mother in Borama, in the Awadal Region of Somaliland. When she visited the Regional Hospital, she was saddened by the conditions of the hospital. The infrastructure needed considerable work. For example; the dark green walls and poor lighting in the operating room made surgeries difficult and dangerous to perform. The infant mortality rate was high, and many citizens were unable to receive adequate care.

Through her compassion, strength and dedication to helping others, Nimo spearheaded efforts to improve the conditions of the hospital. It took three years, but through hard work, the hospital was completely made over. Borama Regional Hospital became a teaching hospital for Amoud University with an outpatient

department, a female and male surgical ward, a pediatric ward, a fully functioning laboratory, an x-ray department and an emergency department.



Nimo is currently on a one year leave of absence from JFS to return to Somalia with the goal of ensuring that those who need medical care and cannot afford it do, in fact, receive the care they need. We wish her luck and are proud to have her on our team.


